The face is central to how we are seen by the world, how people respond to us, and how we read and understand others. The face is how we judge and are judged, our single most important feature.

Despite this, not enough is known about facial disease, injury and deformity, their psychological and emotional impact and, critically, which treatments are most effective. The effects of facial diseases and injuries are devastating, and the whole area has been seriously under-researched. The Facial Surgery Research Foundation - Saving Faces was formed to conduct research into the causes

and treatment of diseases, injury and deformity affecting the face and mouth. We have recently opened the De Lotbiniere Facial Surgery Research Centre to carry out a critically needed programme of research. The research will be guided by our Research Committee which comprises many of the most eminent scientists and doctors interested in the area.
